GATHERING & WELCOME

Call to Worship to Honor Our Immigrant and Refugee Sisters and Brothers

Pastor: The need to care for and the need to be cared for is another expression of the

same basic idea. Such needs are organic whether psychological or spiritual.

Congregation: Therefore, whenever the individual is cut off from nourishment from

others, the result is a wasting away, a starvation, a failure of one's life to

be sustained and nourished.

Pastor: The human spirit cannot abide the enforced loneliness of isolation. We

literally feed on each other.

Congregation: Where this nourishment is not available, the human spirit and human

body both sicken and die.


Pastor: The purpose of all arrangements and agreements under which people live

in society is to nourish one another with one another.

Congregation: Life feeds on life; life is nourished by life. It is life's experience with

itself that establishes the ground for eternal life.

PRAYER OF THE DAY

Gracious and glorious God, in the midst of our loneliness and despair, we still hear your voice echoing through our souls calling us to serve your people. Help us, we pray to heed the anguish of those who live with the uncertainly of their lives. Help us listen to the sound of your creation, the music of life demanding life and calling us toward justice and peace. We pray this in the name of the Risen God, Jesus Christ. Amen.

FIRST READING I John 4: 7 - 21

Beloved, let us love one another, because love is from God; everyone who loves is born of God and knows God. Whoever does not love does not know God, for God is love. God's love was revealed among us in this way: God sent his only Son into the world so that we might live through him. In this is love, not that we loved God but that he loved us and sent his Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins. Beloved, since God loved us so much, we also ought to love one another. No one has ever seen God; if we love one another, God lives in us, and his love is perfected in us. By this we know that we abide in him and he in us, because he has given us of his Spirit. And we have seen and do testify that the Father has sent his Son as the Savior of the world. God abides in those who confess that Jesus is the Son of God, and they abide in God. So we have known and believe the love that God has for us. God is love, and those who abide in love abide in God, and God abides in them. Love has been perfected among us in this: that we may have boldness on the day of judgment, because as he is, so are we in this world. There is no fear in love, but perfect love casts out fear; for fear has to do with punishment, and whoever fears has not reached perfection in love. We love because he first loved us. Those who say, "I love God," and hate their brothers or sisters, are liars; for those who do not love a brother or sister whom they have seen, cannot love God whom they have not seen. The commandment we have from him is this: those who love God must love their brothers and sisters also.

SECOND READING


"Oscar's" story is a composite of multiple stories that share the truth of the experiences of those detained at NORCOR and other facilities. This protects the identities of the detainees.



Oscar has lived in the United States since he was eight years old, and this is home for him and his family. He finds comfort in reading the Bible, and in drawing. This helps calm his mind and gives him hope while in captivity. He reports that the last time he came into NORCOR, his drawing pencils were

seized along with most of his personal possessions. Sometimes NORCOR lets detainees keep their items; sometimes they take everything, even their clothes— it seems arbitrary and feels punitive.

GOSPEL John 15: 1-8






OFFERTORY PRAYER



PRAYER AFTER COMMUNION



WORSHIP NOTES FOR EASTER SEASON

In 2016, the Oregon Synod of the ELCA became the first in the synod to declare themselves a "Sanctuary Synod." The statement - passed by all of us through our governing body - encourages us to "become Sanctuary churches ready to protect refugees and undocumented sisters and brothers from arrest and deportation by Immigration and Customs Enforcement officers."

Bethel joins with the Interfaith Movement for Immigrant Justice to lift up immigrants who live and work in our community. We give thanks for the many gifts and talents they bring to our nation. We give thanks for all who live in our community who came here to escape poverty, oppression or violence; and for those who came seeking opportunity.
