



Welcoming the Darkness | Advent, 2018

I will give you the treasures of darkness and riches hidden in secret places, so that you may know that it is I, the LORD, the God of Israel, who call you by your name.— Isaiah 45:3

Treasures in Darkness?

So much of our culture focuses on light, and so much of our thoughts about darkness are fearful and foreboding. But in our biblical and spiritual traditions, there are treasures to be discovered in darkness. Where best to be hide these treasures than in dark places where we often do not want to look? Advent is a time to welcome the darkness! We invite the Bethel Community to journey together to discover the gifts of darkness, to uncover the hidden treasures of night, to welcome the darkness!

Jan Richardson, **Night Visions: Searching the Shadows of Advent and Christmas**. She writes: "The season of Advent means there is something on the horizon the likes of which we have never seen before. It is not possible to keep it from coming, because it will. That's just how Advent works. What is possible, is not to see it, to miss it, to turn just as it brushes past you. So stay,. Sit. Linger. Tarry. Ponder. Wait. Behold. Wonder.

There will be time for enough for running. For rushing. For worrying. For pushing. For now, stay. Wait. Something is on the horizon."

A Word About today's Translation of the Lord's Prayer

Parker J. Palmer is a world-renowned writer, speaker and activist who focuses on issues in education, community, leadership, spirituality and social change. He has reached millions worldwide through his nine books, including *Let Your Life Speak*, *The Courage to Teach*, and *A Hidden Wholeness*. Parker Palmer holds a Ph.D. in sociology from the University of California at Berkeley, as well as eleven honorary doctorates and numerous other academic awards. He is a member of the Religious Society of Friends (Quaker).

A bit of his spirituality can be found in a recent meditation published in *On Being*, March 6, 2018:

Today is a good time to remind ourselves that — in places around this country and around the world — people wake up empty and frightened every day because of the non-stop violence in their lives. Our hearts must go out to them.

As we grieve terrible events — and do what we can to make our families, neighborhoods, communities, nation, and planet a safe place for all beings — it is equally important to celebrate the beauty of life and express our gratitude for it.

So today, I am asking myself this question: This day, and every day, what might it mean for me to "kneel and kiss the ground"?

Today, like every other day, we wake up empty and frightened. Don't open the door to the study and begin reading. Take down a musical instrument. Let the beauty we love be what we do. There are a hundred ways to kneel and kiss the ground.
