

1 Corinthians 15:12-20


Now if Christ is proclaimed as raised from the dead, how can some of you say there is no resurrection of the dead? If there is no resurrection of the dead, then Christ has not been raised; and if Christ has not been raised, then our proclamation has been in vain and your faith has been in vain. We are even found to be misrepresenting God, because we testified of God that he raised Christ—whom he did not raise if it is true that the dead are not raised. For if the dead are not raised, then Christ has not been raised. If Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile and you are still in your sins. Then those also who have died in Christ have perished. If for this life only we have hoped in Christ, we are of all people most to be pitied.

But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have died.

- "But woe to you who are rich, for you have received your consolation.
- "Woe to you who are full now, for you will be hungry.
- "Woe to you who are laughing now, for you will mourn and weep.
- "Woe to you when all speak well of you, for that is what their ancestors did to the false prophets."

Last fall I asked my niece, Miriam, if she would like to invite her disabled friend, Walt, to join us for the Bethel play. He was struggling, after moving into a care facility. He needed more help than he could get at home. He accepted the invitation to see Reanimated: The Bride of Frankenpastor and had a wonderful time, expressing to Miriam that it was more fun than he had enjoyed for ages!

A few days later he died unexpectedly. His death was sooner than was expected. I just want all of you, the Bethel Players and Bethel members and friends, to know that you truly gave a special gift to this kind and compassionate man! And I give thanks that you share your gifts to bring joy and laughter to so many!
