that in their busyness they may serve you before all else.





The Holy Gospel according to John the eleventh chapter.

Worship Notes:

- *Assigned readers will speak the parts of Martha, Mary, Jesus and Thomas.*

There was a certain man named Lazarus, who was sick. He and his sisters, Mary and Martha, were from the village of Bethany. Mary was the one who had anointed the feet of Jesus with perfume and dried his feet with her hair, and it was her brother Lazarus who was sick. The sisters sent this message to Jesus:

Martha and Mary: "Rabbi, the one you love is sick."

When Jesus heard this, he said,

Jesus: "This sickness will not end in death; it is happening for God's Glory so that God's Only Begotten may be glorified because of it."

Jesus loved these three very much. Yet even after hearing that Lazarus was sick, he remained where he was staying for two more days. Finally, he said to the disciples,

Jesus: "Let's go back to Judea."

They protested,

Disciples: "Rabbi, it was only recently that they tried to stone you—and you want to go back there again?"

Jesus: "Aren't there twelve hours of daylight? Those who walk by day don't stumble, because they see the world bathed in light; those who go walking by night will stumble because there is not light in them."

After Jesus said this, he said to the disciples,

Jesus: "Our beloved Lazarus has fallen asleep. I am going to Judea to wake him."

The disciples objected,

Disciples: "But Rabbi, if he's only asleep, he'll be fine."

Jesus had been speaking about Lazarus' death, but they thought he was talking about actual sleep. So he said very plainly,

Jesus: "Lazarus is dead! For your sakes I am glad that I wasn't there, that you might come to believe. In any event, let us go to him."

Then Thomas, "the Twin," said to the rest,

Thomas: "Let's go with Jesus, so we can die with him."

When Jesus arrived in Bethany, he found that Lazarus had already been in the tomb for four days. Since Bethany was only about two miles from Jerusalem, many people had come out to console Martha and Mary about their brother. When Martha heard that Jesus was coming, she went to meet him, while Mary stayed at home with the mourners. When she got to Jesus, Martha said,

Martha: "If you had been here, my brother would never have died! Yet even now, I am sure that God will give you whatever you ask."

Jesus: "Your brother will rise again!"

Jesus assured her. Martha replied,

Martha: "I know he will rise again in the resurrection on the last day."

Jesus: "I am the Resurrection, and I am Life: those who believe in me will live, even if they die; and those who are alive and believe in me will never die. Do you believe this?"

Martha: "Yes! I have come to believe that you are the Messiah, God's Only Begotten, the One who is coming into the world."

When she had said this, Martha went back and called her sister Mary.

Martha: "The teacher is here, asking for you."

As soon as Mary heard this, she got up and went to him. Jesus hadn't gotten to the village yet. He was at the place where Martha had met him. Those who were there consoling her saw her get up quickly and followed Mary, thinking she was going to the tomb to mourn. When Mary got to Jesus, she fell at his feet and said,

Mary: "If you had been here, Lazarus never would have died."

When Jesus saw her weeping, and the other mourners as well, he was troubled in spirit, moved by the deepest emotions.

Jesus: "Where have you laid him?"

Martha and Mary: "Come and see."

And Jesus wept. The people in the crowd began to remark, "See how much he loved him!" Others said, "He made the blind person see; why couldn't he have done something to prevent Lazarus' death?" Jesus was again deeply moved. They approached the tomb, which was a cave with a stone in front of it.

Jesus: "Take away the stone."

Martha: "Rabbi, it has been four days now. By this time there will be a stench."

Jesus: "Didn't I assure you that if you believed you would see the glory of God?"

So they took the stone away. Jesus raised his eyes to heaven and said,

Jesus: "Abba, thank you for having heard me. I know that you always hear me, but I have said this for the sake of the crowd, that they might believe that you sent me!"

Then Jesus called out in a loud voice,

Jesus: "Lazarus, come out!"

And Lazarus came out of the tomb, still bound hand and foot with linen strips, his face wrapped in a cloth. Jesus told the crowd,

Jesus: "Untie him and let him go free."

Many of those who had come to console Martha and Mary, and saw what Jesus did, put their faith in him.





Our Lenten Prayers

Here at Bethel, we are offering a couple of opportunities during Lent to deepen our spiritual lives.

We invite you to light a candle, whenever you are moved to do so – for example at the beginning of the service during the Prelude music, during the time of Confession and Forgiveness, Offering, or the Distribution of Communion. We will also have a station for individual blessing and prayer during Holy Communion. On Sunday, the First Sunday in Lent, you will see a large frame with chicken wire stretched in the frame. There will be a supply of paper (purple) with a space for writing a prayer; something that is resting on your heart. When you are ready, you are invited to write your thoughts and prayers on the paper, roll it up and place it in one of the holes of the chicken wire. We will be collecting your prayers in this way during the entirety of Lent.

Parsonage Project

Congregational Action:

On Sunday, March 31, 2019, members of the Congregation voted unanimously to pass a Resolution that formally authorized Bethel Lutheran Church to borrow up to \$100,000 to fund the improvements and repairs to the parsonage. Thank you to everyone who was able to attend and support this important step in the process.

The Project Itself

Demolition is the first part of remodeling. Superior Construction Services (SCS) has begun. The kitchen and downstairs bathroom will be new. The upstairs half-bath is getting a shower to make a full new bathroom. The oil furnace was removed and we've completed the environmental work on the oil tank outside. The gas line is installed for a complete heating and air conditioning unit – the super cool kind that heats/cool by zone.

Also:

- Plumbing and electrical systems are being revamped
- Beautiful wood floors are being refinished
- Broken windows are being replaced
- An egress window is being added to the basement
- There will be new window wells and windows in the basement
- Come see new appliances, and new lighting!

On-going Fundraising

We simply cannot do this without you! We are encouraging all Bethel members and friends to consider how they might be able to support this important project with their pocketbooks.

Food Ministry Team

The Food Ministry team meets the first Monday of every month to, among other goals, more intentionally manage the Sunday morning breakfast service.

At our April meeting, we acknowledged:

Two generous gifts made by FoBs to the Food Ministry, the renewal of the grant of funds from the St. Vincent DePaul Society at Holy Redeemer Catholic Church and the incredible gift of volunteer time, both from the FoB community, but also from the houseless community.

On Sunday, we had four (or maybe it was five) people from the community helping in the kitchen.

We also are fine tuning the traffic flow and confirmed that we will maintain a 75 person limit in the room at any one time. We are perfecting our policy on the admission of Service Dogs.
