with calves a year old?

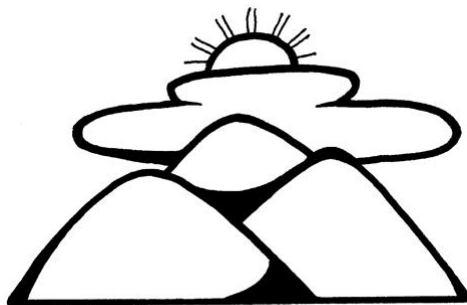

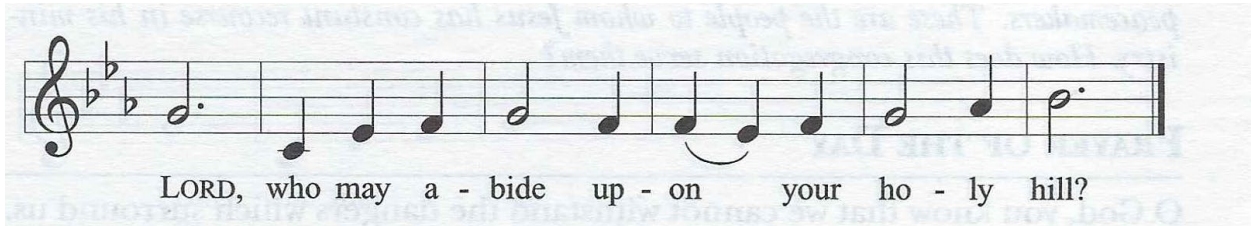


## Psalm 27:1, 4-5, 8

## Second Reading

## 1 Corinthians 1:18-31

A reading from First Corinthians.

The message about the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God. For it is written,

"I will destroy the wisdom of the wise,  
and the discernment of the discerning I will thwart."

Where is the one who is wise? Where is the scribe? Where is the debater of this age? Has not God made foolish the wisdom of the world? For since, in the wisdom of God, the world did not know God through wisdom, God decided, through the foolishness of our proclamation, to save those who believe. For Jews demand signs and Greeks desire wisdom, but we proclaim Christ crucified, a stumbling block to Jews and foolishness to Gentiles, but to those who are the called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God. For God's foolishness is wiser than human wisdom, and God's weakness is stronger than human strength.

Consider your own call, brothers and sisters: not many of you were wise by human standards, not many were powerful, not many were of noble birth. But God chose what is foolish in the world to shame the wise; God chose what is weak in the world to shame the strong; God chose what is low and despised in the world, things that are not, to reduce to nothing things that are, so that no one might boast in the presence of God. He is the source of your life in Christ Jesus, who became for us wisdom from God, and righteousness and sanctification and redemption, in order that, as it is written, "Let the one who boasts, boast in the Lord."

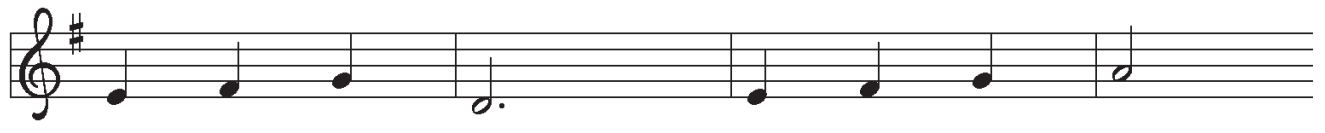



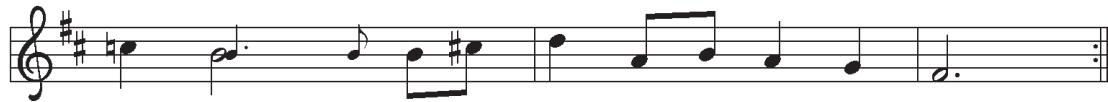

## 2020 Annual Meeting Summary

We had a fantastic annual meeting of the congregation on Sunday, January 26. Although 2019 was a rough year and we remain in a state of transition, those in attendance were optimistic, creative, supportive, and listened to each other. Although you can request the complete draft of the meeting minutes from the church office, here are a few highlights:

### Finances

Even after hours of hard work and creative problem-solving by the Bethel Finance Team (Meghan Cyr, Dorian Bentley, and Stephanie Burdick), we still ended 2019 with a \$13,000 deficit. When we combine that with the forecasted deficit for 2020, we expect our total deficit to climb to \$18,000. The congregation agreed to seek help from the Bethel Players, move money from memorial funds to the general budget, embark on an estimated giving campaign (to forecast our income), and to return in April for a quarterly congregational meeting focused on the budget and fundraising.

### Interim pastors

Bethel will continue with substitute pastors through at least the month of February as we remain in conversation with Juan Carlos La Puente Tapia of the Oregon Synod about bringing on an interim pastor. He is listening to our needs and looking for skilled interim pastors that would be a good fit for Bethel. With our current budget, Bethel is able to afford a half-time interim. Did you know that interim pastors are specifically trained in helping churches through transition? They help congregations like ours prepare for the call process of a permanent pastor.

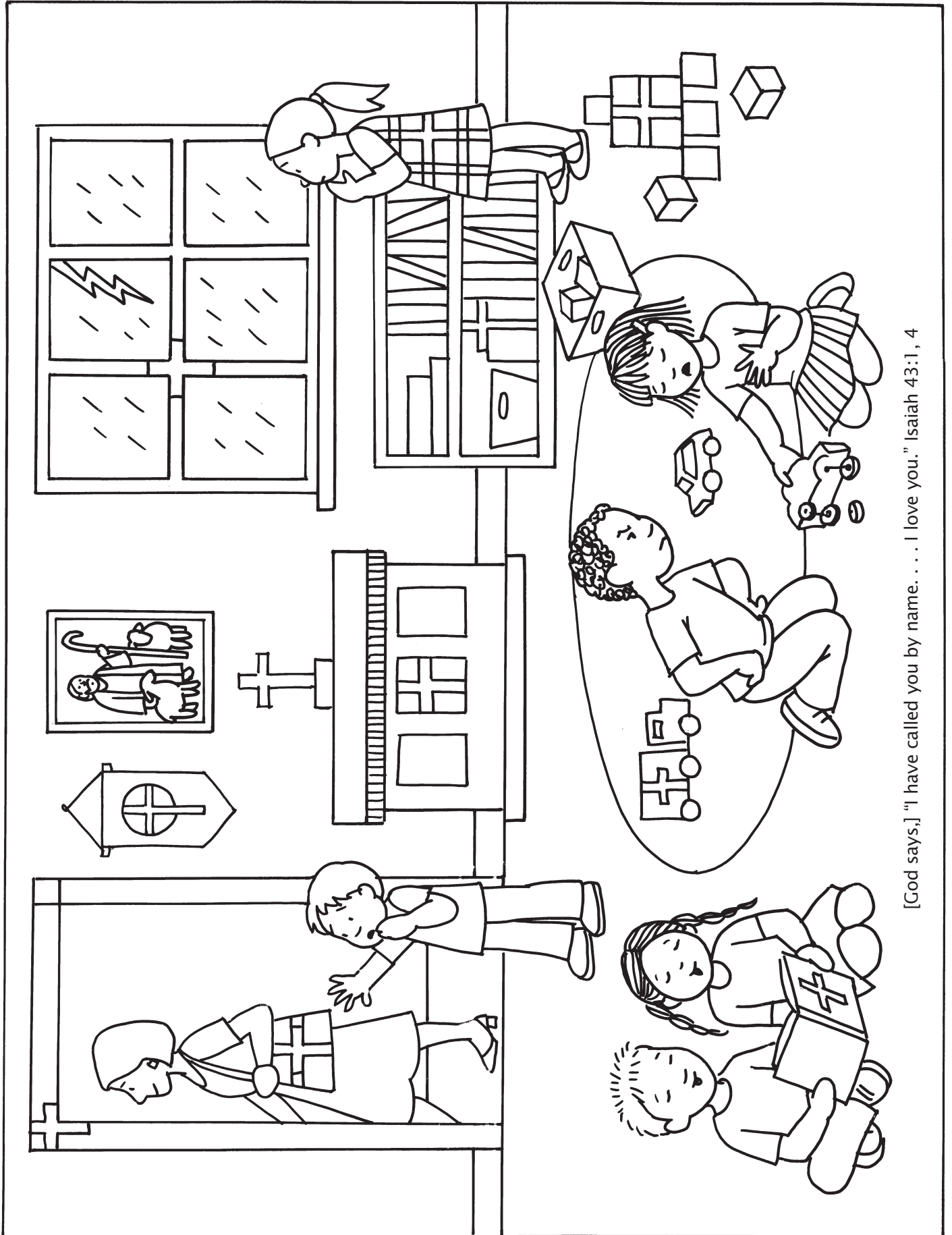
