


SERVICE OF LIGHT

PSALM, READING & CANTICLE

Psalm 141

O Lord, I call to you, come to me now; O hear my voice when I cry to you! Let my prayer rise up like incense before you , The lifting up of my hands as an offering to you. Keep watch within me, O God, deep in my heart; May the light of your love be burning brightly within me!

Incense may be lit. You may lift your hands in silent prayer and meditation

May our prayers come before you, O God, as incense,

And may your presence surround and fill us, so that in union with all creation, we might praise you for your love in our lives. Amen.

First Reading

Finally, be strong in the Lord and in the strength of his power. Put on the whole armor of God, so that you may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil. For our struggle is not against enemies of blood and flesh, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the cosmic powers of this present darkness, against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places. Therefore take up the whole armor of God, so that you may be able to withstand on that evil day, and having done every-thing, to stand firm. Stand therefore, and fasten the belt of truth around your waist, and put on the breastplate of righteousness. As shoes for your feet put on whatever will make you ready to proclaim the gospel of peace. With all of these, take the shield of faith, with which you will be able to quench all the flaming arrows of the evil one. Take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God. Pray in the Spirit at all times in every prayer and supplication. To that end keep alert and always persevere in supplication for all the saints. Pray also for me, so that when I speak, a message may be given to me to make known with boldness the mystery of the gospel.

Second Reading

St. Patrick's Breastplate

Patrick, along with Brigid, is the Patron Saint of Ireland. A Britain, he was captured by pirates and sold into slavery in Ireland. He escaped only to return as a Priest and Bishop who proclaimed the Gospel of forgiveness and grace to his former captors. According to tradition, he used the shamrock with its three "leaves" to explain the Trinity to those he baptized.

He composed this daily prayer over a lifetime of facing many dangers and much beauty:


I bind unto myself today the strong Name of the Trinity by invocation of the same, the Three in One and One in Three. I bind this day to me forever, by power of faith, Christ's incarnation, his baptism in the Jordan River, his cross of death for my salvation, his bursting from the spiced tomb, his riding up the heavenly way, his coming at the day of doom, I bind unto myself today. I bind unto myself today the virtues of the starlit heaven, the glorious Sun's life-giving ray, the whiteness of the Moon at evening, the flashing of the lightning free, the whirling wind's tempestuous shocks, the stable earth, the deep salt sea, around the old eternal rocks. Christ be with me. Christ within me, Christ behind me, Christ before me, Christ beside me, Christ to win me, Christ to comfort and restore me, Christ beneath me, Christ above me, Christ in guiet, Christ in danger. Christ in hearts of all that love me, Christ in mouth of friend and stranger. I bind unto myself the Name, the strong Name of the Trinity by invocation of the same, the three in One and One in Three, of whom all nature has creation, Eternal Father, Spirit, Word. Praise to the Lord of my salvation; salvation is of Christ the Lord!






The Annunciation & The Magnificent
