



#### **Congregational Meeting**

Sunday, 10/17 after worship online & in person

There will be a brief congregational meeting on Sunday, 10/17 immediately after service (and just before the monthly council meeting!) You can remain on Zoom after service if you are attending virtually. If you are attending Bethel physically, we look forward to seeing your face in person!

The purpose of the meeting is to ask for congregational approval of funds to pay for the plumbing repairs in the basement kitchen. Council previously agreed to pay "up to \$2500.00" for the initial clean-out work to be done. That work is complete, or nearly complete. Additional monies need to be allocated to cover installation of a grease interceptor, cement work and new floor tiles in the basement. Council is waiting for a new bid for this work, but believe it will be around \$8500.00. The final bid amount will be available at the meeting.

#### Funds are available to cover the costs from several programs including:

- Bethel Players table money
- Youth Drop-in program
- Food Ministry program.

Your vote is needed to approve these repairs and costs.

Joan was a lifelong friend of Bethel and the BLCW, and she was a Bethel member for many years. Joan loved working as cook and kitchen manager for the Bethel Neighborhood Youth Drop-In summer programs, where the children called her Miss Joanie. The Drop-In kids misheard her name for her popular minestrone soup, re-branded as Miss Joanie Soup, and often begged her to make another batch.

Joan Barber passed away this last April. She was born in 1934 in Virginia MN to Grant Sherman and Agnes Jensen. Her husband, Lawrence Barber (Gene) and brother Clifford (Cliffy) predeceased her. She is survived by her children, Catherine, David (Linda), and Michael (Kari), and grandchildren Christopher and Jessica.

Joan will be greatly missed. Mom lived a full life raising three children and countless dogs. She was involved in various churches during her life (Bethel Lutheran, Peace Lutheran, Portsmouth Trinity Lutheran, Holy Cross Catholic). She became a devoted Seahawks fan in her later years and was buried wearing her blue and green jersey.
