Welcome to Bethel Lutheran Church

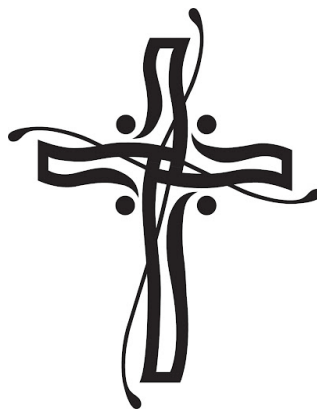

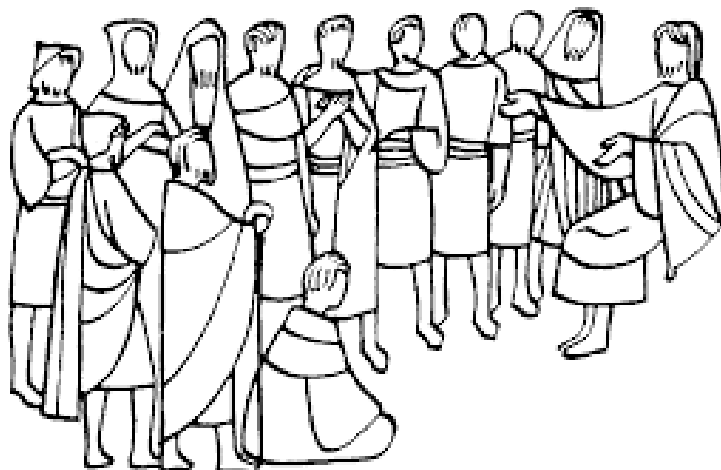
Let us confess our sin in the presence of God and of one another.

The Lord's Prayer

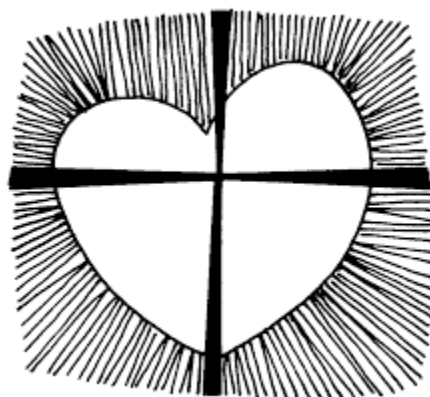
Gathered into one by the Holy Spirit, let us pray as Jesus taught us:

Carolyn Beck (spouse of Jim)

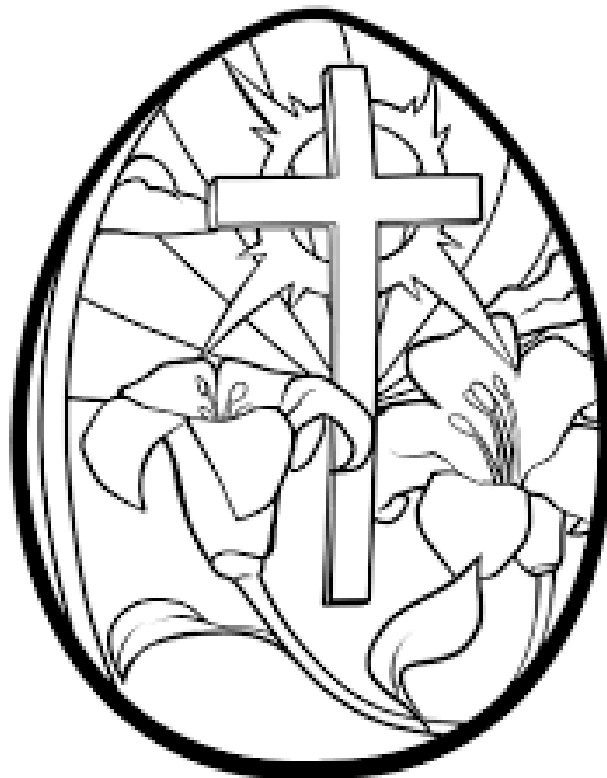
Margie Fletcher (spouse of Michael and mother of Micah and Mitchell)
