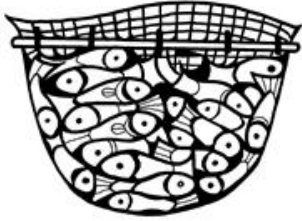




3rd Sunday after Epiphany

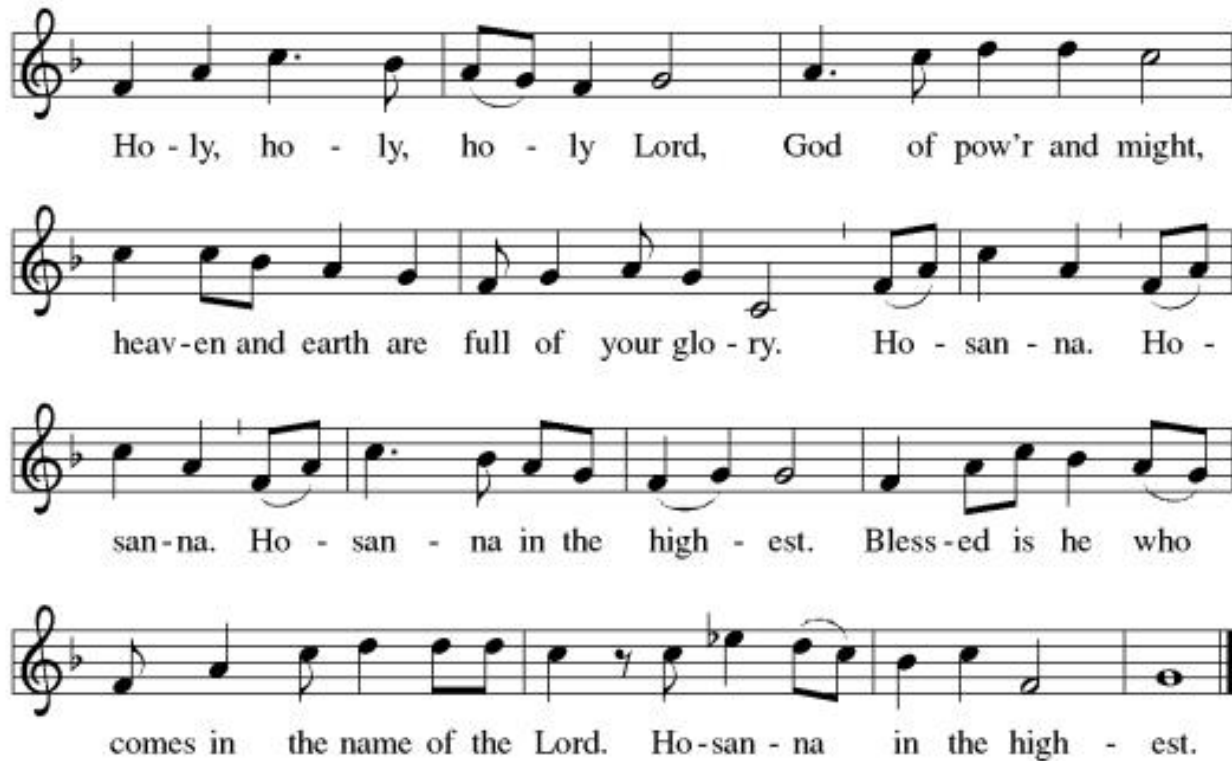

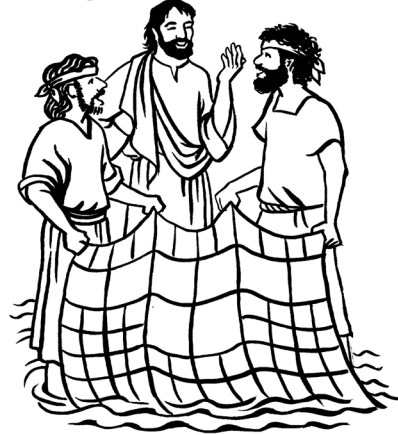
