receive the grace and forgiveness of God

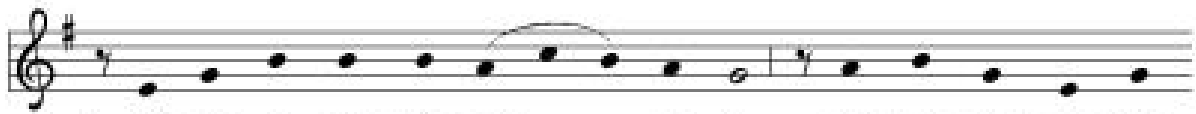

you have taken no pleasure.

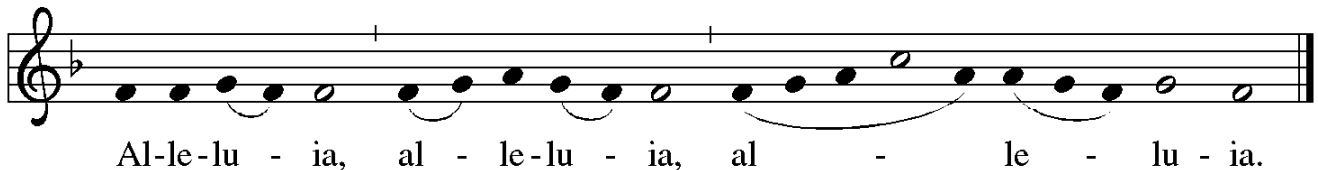
⁷ Then I said, ‘See, God, I have come to do your will, O God’





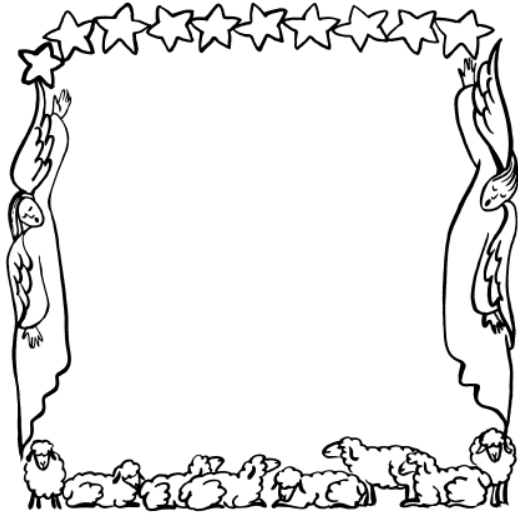
